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Superintendent Comments from April 28 BOE meeting

I'd like to devote my comments this evening to an important and positive topic, which is the growing and evolving diversity of our town and district. Last night was the Multicultural Celebration at DeMasi for the DeMasi, Beeler, and Van Zant School communities. This incredible event gets bigger and more amazing each year. I'd like to give a special shout to teachers Rob Fox and Sara Smith for their leadership in organizing it, and to all the DMS staff, administration, teachers, as well as the staff of Beeler and VZ, who played roles in making it happen and attended in support. And thank you to our families and students, who danced and performed in the gym, ran a game in the small gym, hosted fun educational and interactive tables in this very cafeteria, and prepared and served amazing food. The energy, the excitement throughout, was palpable and powerful. Everyone celebrating each other's differences and backgrounds, all together as a larger family of schools and district. The diversity of our district is growing and evolving. Last Friday the festival called Eid al-Fitr ("Eed al fitter"), which literally means Breaking of the Fast, took place around the world and in homes in Evesham, marking the end of Ramadan, the most religious month in the Islamic calendar. It's a joyous occasion when Muslims attend prayers in the morning, visit with loved ones and neighbors, and enjoy a delicious traditional feast with friends and family.

Acknowledging different cultural celebrations is important, especially in classrooms and schools where many ethnicities come together every day. It helps all of our students feel seen, heard, and supported. And as part of that responsibility, our district plans to explore possibly recognizing other key holidays in our 2024-25 district calendar. This begins by trying to wrap our arms around our whole district, to gather in perspectives. We will use our Back to School forms this August to seek input from our staff and families about what holidays they celebrate that they would like to see in our calendar, but are not currently included. We will use this information, as well as other means, such as researching other districts' approaches, to consider additions for 2024-25. We develop each coming year's calendar during the winter and typically use our February Board meeting for that calendar's first reading. We will make every effort to keep the school year from getting longer. At the same time, as with all our decisions and processes, we weigh pros and cons on the many armed scale, to determine the best path forward. And the pros of a district calendar updated to reflect and embrace our community of families today is of vital importance to the success of our students today and for all tomorrows to come. I would like to thank everyone, parents, staff, and students, who have reached out to me about the possibility of adding particular holidays to our calendar. All voices matter. Your voices matter.
